# First Things First...

At the present, however, I am going to Jerusalem bringing aid to the Saints. For Macedonia and Achaia have been pleased to make some contribution for the poor among the saints at Jerusalem. For they were pleased to do it...

Romans 8: 25-27a

I want to be sure I'm not comparing apples to oranges because the need of the saints in Jerusalem came because they were persecuted for their faith in Christ as Savior and Lord, but a need is a need, so...

Recently, I read a letter from a sister LCMC congregation on Kodiak Island, Alaska. This is the second appeal our congregation has received from Saint Paul Lutheran Church. I confess upon seeing the first letter (Spring 2024), I summarily passed over it. Since reading the second missal, it has been heavy on my heart that I ignored the plea for help. I want to share a portion of their request.

"We organized and started our church in 1969... We were able to build our church building in the late 1970s. Over the years since that time, in addition to ministering and serving the needs of our congregation, our mission has been to share the love of Christ with others. Our mission projects have included providing a Christian-based preschool to the families in our community, sponsoring 2 refugee families to relocate and get established on the island, assisting seminary students with scholarship money, helping to provide food to people in need in our community and state, supporting people with addiction issues who are in crisis on Kodiak, supporting faith-based organizations in our community, state, nation, and internationally with money for programs wherever the need was greatest.

Now we are hoping that you find it in your heart to help us. Kodiak Island is a beautiful island in the Gulf of Alaska. Our weather conditions are often harsh - combining moisture, cold temperatures, and very high winds, which in combination with salt air and volcanic ash, are very hard on any structures. The roof of our church has suffered a catastrophic failure and will need nearly total reconstruction (from sheetrock to shingles). With the cost of shipping and construction on a remote island, the estimates that we have received to replace the failed roof structure are more than \$500,000. A project of this magnitude is devastating to a church our size. [The average Sunday attendance is 32, almost the same as ours. -editor] Last spring when we realized how much this repair would potentially cost, we reached out to our LCMC church family and asked for help. 68 churches and individual people from those churches responded with prayers and gifts. Between what our members have given and the money from our LCMC family, we have raised \$175,000 of the estimated \$500,000 plus we will need to rebuild our roof. We are thrilled at the responses and prayers we have received and have been able to complete the first of five

phases that will be required to rebuild our roof. We do not know if helping us with a financial gift to help rebuild our roof is something your congregation can do, but we would appreciate you considering our request. If there are any questions that we can answer, please feel free to call."

I encourage you to pray for this sister congregation, and further, to seek the Lord's guidance if you as an individual or we as a congregation can help alleviate the need of Saint Paul Lutheran. According to the website, there are 832 LCMC congregations in the United States. 68 congregations and individuals have already assisted in the need. That means at least 628 congregations have not responded. If those 628 would each donate \$600 to Saint Paul's project that would raise slightly more than the \$375,000 needed to complete their roof replacement. Prayer is appreciated, but when combined with action, it becomes an outpouring of God's grace and blessings. The saying is true: you cannot outgive God. As Paul wrote to the church at Corinth, "We want you to know, brothers, about the grace of God that has been given among the churches of Macedonia, for in a severe test of affliction, their abundance of joy and their extreme poverty have overflowed in a wealth of generosity on their part for they gave according to their means, as I can testify, and beyond their means, of their own accord, begging us earnestly for the favor of taking part in the relief of the saints-and this, not as we expected, but they gave themselves first to the Lord and then by the will of God to us..." (2 Corinthians 8:1-5).






# First School And Day Care




